

Getting Creative to Break Down Barriers to Dialysis Care in Nursing Homes

Whether short-term or long-term, there may be a time in a patient's life when nursing home (NH) care is needed. Some NHs can provide hemodialysis and/or peritoneal dialysis on-site. While there are benefits to on-site dialysis services, there also can be barriers to achieving quality outcomes. Use this resource to break down some of the commonly reported barriers and explore possible solutions.
