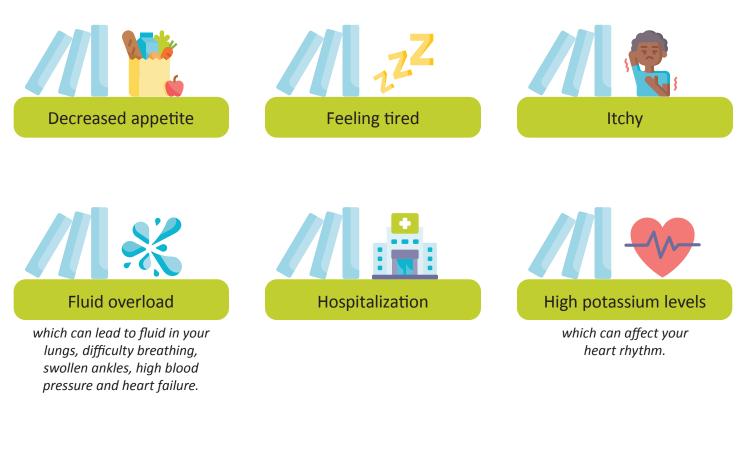
Don't Play Games With Your Health The Dangerous Domino Effect of Missing Treatments
